- seek funding from \$50 to \$3000

## Applicants should be:

- non-government, not-for-profit organisations or individuals
- Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander, migrant and CALD communities are encouraged to apply

## Projects should target:

- the public / community groups / service users / audiences which are primarily non-government

## Please note:

- The AWRBC cannot guarantee successful applicants will be offered the full amount requested.
- the committee will accept re-submitted, previously unsuccessful applications

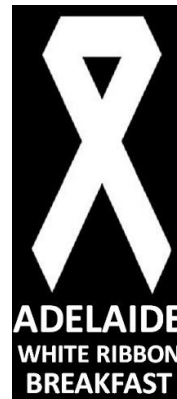

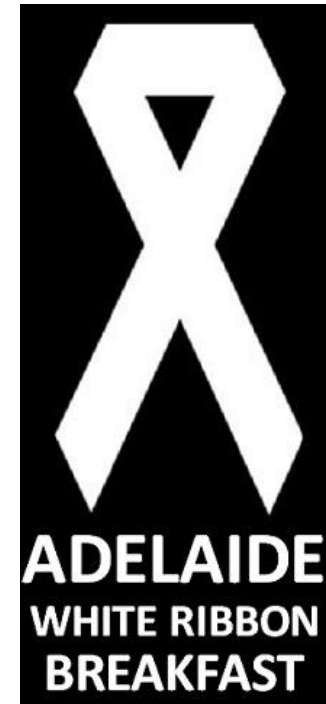

The Adelaide White Ribbon Breakfast is held on, or close to November 25<sup>th</sup> each year. It is one of Australia's premier White Ribbon events. In 2017 over 1300 people attended, including VIPs, MPs, business and community leaders and members of the public.

The White Ribbon Campaign is the first and largest male engagement campaign to eliminate men's violence against women.
